The mild winter weather seemed to raise spirits high as we gathered for our first annual meeting of 2012. Nanci Konopasek led the meeting and received well-deserved thanks for her successful year of leadership. After a review of 2011, Nanci presided over the nomination of Vickie Gill as the new assistant moderator for 2012. This selection was enthusiastically approved by consensus. Jack Billion was introduced as the new moderator for 2012.

The 2012 budget was presented next and discussed. The budget was approved by consensus. We also took this opportunity to review the progress of our "What If" Campaign. We made all regular 2011 principle payments (\$28,374) from the campaign proceeds and additional payments (\$94,188) to reduce principle. Our mortgage amount now stands at \$498,234 as of 12-31-2011, down from \$620,795 on 01-01-2011. Congratulations to all!

The Search Committee that will oversee the selection of a second pastor was then presented. The committee was selected from a list of extremely well qualified candidates and my thanks go out to all those who offered to serve in this capacity. Sadly we couldn't pick you all. The committee members (in alphabetical order) are: Connie Applequist, Keith Block, Ron Fahy, Richard Getting, Tina Harp, Dana Loseke, Elaine McKittrick, and Kristen Peterson. Pastor Jean, Moderator Jack Billion, and Assistant Moderator Vickie Gill will serve as ex-officio members. The committee was approved by consensus. The Search Committee's first meeting will be Wednesday, February 8th starting at 6:30 p.m.

Also approved by consensus was our pilot program for expanded governance. Our goal is fewer meetings and more ACTION! As we share the ministry workloads in this new format, we hope to involve more people, doing smaller jobs that they enjoy, working less and just having more fun. We will be explaining this in the coming months so stay alert! We hope you like it!

Leadership Council will meet on Sunday, February 26. That's enough "Moments" for now.

"Out of Babylon"

-by Walter Brueggemann

The Question:

Professor Walter Brueggemann proclaims that the Bible is a beautifully subversive political document that describes the hope of a new type of neighborhood/community/covenant characterized by justice, love and peace.

In *"Out of Babylon,"* Brueggemann explores what it means to be living in exile within the Empire. He draws from the prophets who emerged during the Israelite's exile in Babylon. Ancient Babylon was the center of learning, commerce, wealth and religion. As a culture, it was devoted to materialism, extravagance and luxury. It was a privileged society, not unlike Western society today. Through Brueggemann's close examination of the prophetic writing of Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel, we see that the prophets created radical social, political, and religious dissention using poetic language to inspire action.

Brueggemann challenges us to think about who we are as Christians today living in a modern day Babylon. How do we characterize the Empire? Who are the prophetic voices today? What are they saying? How are we, as Christians, being inspired to action?

MUCH DESERVED SABBATICAL

The Pastor Parish Relations Committee and Pastor Jean are currently planning for the sabbatical she so richly deserves. This three-month renewal time is part of the covenant Spirit of Peace makes with its pastor. We are a year late in providing it for her because of our hopes for a Lilly Foundation grant to support it. Sadly, we did not receive the grant, but the vision and substance for a sabbatical that we created together as we wrote the grant run deep, and for three months this summer our congregation will support Pastor Jean in realizing much of the plan of renewal we dreamed for her and for our congregation. The Leadership Council is hard at work seeing to the coverage of ministerial and administrative work in her absence.

What is a sabbatical and why is it so valuable for our Pastor and for the congregation? A Pastor is at the very center of the life of a congregation and balances the smallest details with the loftiest purposes as she seeks to manifest the love of God for individuals and for the community. As she pushes and pulls, encourages and challenges, laughs and weeps with others, she explores faith with all around her to inspire compassionate living. A good pastor (and we have one!) must keep in touch with the source of their life and strength if she is to offer life and strength to others. A sabbatical provides time to step back and breathe, read, look, pray, walk, remember, forgive, thank. The Lilly Foundation says it well on its website: "Renewal periods are not vacations, but times for intentional exploration and reflection, for drinking again from God's life-giving waters, for regaining the enthusiasm and creativity for ministry." The Pastor is not the only one who benefits from such a "time away" as we realized so deeply during Rick's illness and dying. The congregation knows itself again as it rises to meet the challenge of keeping itself centered and knowing its power of leadership and healing ministry while the pastor is away. As Pastor Jean progresses in shaping her plans for this summer, more substance will follow.

SOUPER BOWL OF CARING

NOISY OFFERING FEBRUARY 5th

Last year 260,000 youth collected \$9.5 million for hunger relief. This year, the need is even greater. The U.S. Census Bureau reports the number of Americans living in poverty is the highest it has been in 52 years.
