# MODERATOR'S MOMENT

## Dear Spirit of Peace Members and Friends:

As we reach the quarter point of this year 2010, it is great to see all of the momentum building into summer. We put more than \$1,500 into the coffers from the Rummage Sale, the Spirit of Peace Community Garden is well into planting, and your Ministry Teams remain active going into the normally slow summer months. Don't be a stranger during the summer or you'll miss all of the fun!

As we close the first quarter, I would like to update you on our financial performance. To highlight key categories:

Total Income YTD April	\$105,491
Administration	(\$13,367)
Physical Facilities	(\$20,352)
General Maintenance	(\$16,853)
Outreach	(\$ 5,183)
Programs	(\$ 5,265)
Pastoral	(\$46,100)
Total Expenses	(\$107,121)
Net Position	(\$ 1,630)

There are several key points to consider:

- Our actual pledges paid vs. committed are more than 97%. This is well above last year.
- Total Income is 4% higher than budget YTD.
- We have not drawn any funds from our Reserve Account, so our savings are high and dry.
- Our expenses are front loaded in many cases

(snow removal, gas, Interim Pastor), so we will have lower total expenses in the next two quarters.

Things are going well with Spirit of Peace and we have another cause for celebration. Many will not see it as such, but our beloved Kathy is completing her 18 month interim commitment and will be assuming her new assignment with the Dell Rapids United Methodist Church. It is a celebration in that Kathy is answering her calling and we can say we enjoyed and benefited from experiencing her time and talent for the last year and a half. We have been blessed by her presence during a difficult time and view her departure with bittersweet emotions. Kathy's last day with us was last Sunday, May 30<sup>th</sup>. She will be back to preach for the last time on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

In case you are trying to read between the lines on Kathy's departure, the simple truth is that she has great love and commitment for Methodist principals and philosophies, and feels her calling is to teach them in her "home field". We intend to operate with a single pastor model for the foreseeable future, and your leadership team is going through a total personnel assessment to determine what longer term staffing requirements are needed to aid in our growth, from pulpit presence to Christian Education to administrative functions. We will be sharing more specific plans as that assessment gels.

## PROGRESSIVE THEOLOGY

Sunday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, \*\*\*3:00 – 5:00 pm\*\*\*

Discussion: *Resurrection: Myth or Reality* by Bishop John Shelby Spong

Progressive Theology Group will continue their exploration of Bishop Spong's *Resurrection: Myth or Reality*. This 1994 book has been called a “daring examination of the foundational event of Christianity and an inspiring vision for reconciliation between Jews and Christians.” Using approaches from Hebrew interpretive tradition, midrash, Spong pinpoints five clues that help illuminate the mystery of Easter, offering a vital perspective on modern faith and the afterlife. His study affirms the inclusiveness of the Christian message and emphasizes the necessity of mutual integrity and respect among Christians and Jews. ## GUATEMALA SHOE DRIVE

The Spirit of Peace Sunday School children participated in the Sioux Falls Diversity Kiwanis Club's shoe drive for Guatemalan children in the month of March. The kids learned that children in Guatemala are not allowed to attend school without shoes, and many can't afford them. So the kids decorated a collection box for Spirit of Peace, and invited our members to donate new and gently-worn shoes.

Sixty-two pairs of shoes were contributed at the Spirit of Peace collection site. Another 1,400 pairs of shoes were collected throughout the city of Sioux Falls. Thanks to everyone's efforts, the Club will be able to ship 1,165 pairs of shoes to Guatemala and donate 300 pairs of shoes deemed "too large for Guatemalans" to Sioux Falls Lutheran Social Services' Immigration and Refugee Services program. And since the shipping charges were based on volume rather than weight, the Kiwanis Club also stuffed each of the shoes with miscellaneous items it had collected, including thousands of travel soaps, shampoos and lotions, toys, socks, underwear, books, and school supplies.

The Club is shipping the shoes to coordinate their arrival with SFDK Club member Carla Cooley's trip to Guatemala this summer. Carla is participating in a humanitarian mission to distribute and install energy-efficient "ONIL" stoves throughout the city of San Jorge. The stoves use 70% less firewood than

traditional cooking, which helps with deforestation problems in Guatemala and saves families time and resources they would otherwise spend purchasing or gathering firewood. The stoves also vent the smoke out of the family's home, which helps reduce respiratory and vision problems, which are common there due to the amount of smoke ingested from cooking.

Once again, thanks to all who supported our children in this effort, helping to make them more aware of conditions in other parts of the world, and teaching them that when a lot of people do a little bit, they can make a difference.

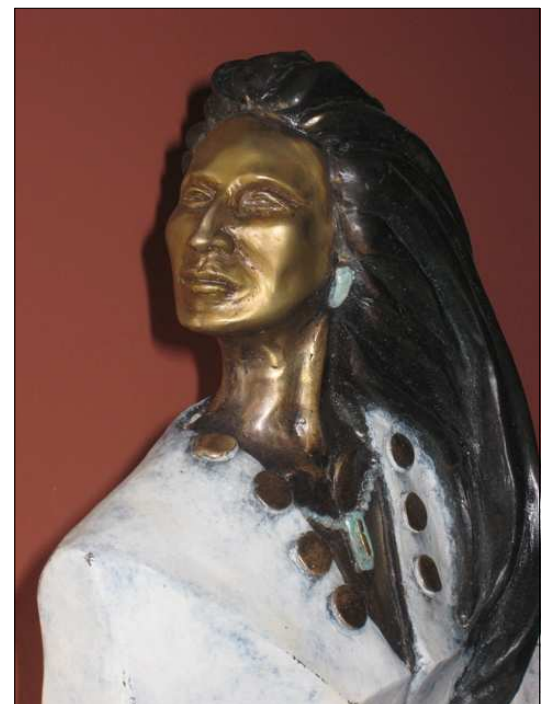
